

Hello my lovely Sunday School,

As always, I'm sending you loads and loads of love. I hope you're doing OK and managing your school work and finding time to have some fun too.

At the start of today's Gospel reading, Jesus says to his disciples, 'If you love me, keep my commandments'. He's talking to them about how they are going to keep working as Christians after he has gone to the Father in heaven. He tells them that he will still be with them and working through them as the Holy Spirit.

So there are a couple of things to think about here, and it might seem a bit complicated, but there is one word in today's reading that we can really hold on to.

Jesus says to his friends – 'If you **love** me, keep my commandments'. Well, we love Jesus – that's what being a Christian is about – we might not always show it perfectly, but we try, through what we do and say to show that we love Him – we are keeping the most important of commandments, because by loving Jesus, we are loving God. Jesus says he will be with the disciples (and us) as the Holy Spirit. Now, I know you guys remember the fruits of the spirit – here's a link that crazy 'fruits of the spirit' song we've listened to a few times if you need a giggle:

The first fruit of the spirit is **love** – without love, none of the other fruits of the spirit would work properly anywayCould you have joy or patience without love? I guess you could, but they would be pretty terrible versions of joy and patience!

So the word that we should focus on here, the word that I've already used 8 times in this message, is **love**. We show our love for Jesus by loving others – that second commandment 'love your neighbour as yourself' means that we have to be kind to and love ourselves and then mirror that love and kindness in the way we treat other people.

And you know, just like you need love in order to have joy or patience, you also need to love yourself and treat yourself kindly so that you can properly 'love your neighbour as yourself'.

Give a little love today – to yourself, to other people and to Jesus.



How much love can you collect as you go through the maze?





How about making this origami heart for someone in your family to show you love them?



Step 1: Start with a square piece of paper with white side up.



Step 3: fold the left corner to the right corner and then unfold



Step 4: Fold the top corner to the centre.



Step 5: Fold the bottom corner to the top edge



Step 6: Fold the bottom left and right edges to the centre crease.
